The other night, as we sat down for our nightly reading with Abby, we opened a new book we had just purchased: Llama Llama Holiday Drama.

This is a book by Anna Dewdney and is another in her series of stories about Llama, his Mama, and his neighborhood friend. Like all the Llama Llama books, this one is in rhyme.

In "Holiday Drama," Llama and his Llama Mama are getting ready for Christmas. Llama sees and hears the changing season: the holiday lights, the Christmas music, the candy and cookies, signs, store displays, snow, and elves. But, on every other page, as Llama takes in all the sights and sounds of the season, he asks his mom over and over and over how much longer he has to wait. And then comes this:

"All this waiting for one day?
Time for presents RIGHT AWAY!
Too much music, too much fluff!
Too much making, too much stuff!
Too much everything for Llama
Llama Llama, HOLIDRAMA!"

We've all felt the same as little Llama. Every year, the rush of the season seems to get pushed further and further back. Store displays start

appearing right after Halloween (or even before, in some places!). We start planning food and shopping lists and travel plans. We can get so overwhelmed by all the things we have to get done for this Christmas season. But, listen to Mama Llama:

"Come and listen, little Llama.
Have a cuddle with your mama.
Sometimes we should take a rest
and hold the ones we love the best.
Wishing, waiting, wanting things...
We forget what this time brings.
Gifts are nice,
but there's another—
The true gift is
we have each other."

This is a season of waiting, watching, and expectation for the coming of God among us in the person of Jesus Christ. Most certainly, the planning and the expectations of our family gatherings can seem to overwhelm us. We can get caught up in the "holidrama" and miss the beauty of this season.

It is God's eternal desire to be in relationship with you and me. God is willing to risk everything; to give up everything, so that you and I might experience fullness of life.

In Jesus, God is born among us so that you and I can more fully live into the fullness of relationship—relationship with God, and our relationships with one another.

That is what this Advent season of waiting is about—preparing ourselves for the coming of God. We reflect on our lives and our relationships. We pray for God's Kingdom come, in which all pain, all sorrow, all war, all death, all brokenness will be restored.

In those time, in those moments, when we feel this season begin to overwhelm us like little llama, remember this: you are beloved of God, redeemed by Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit for life and relationship.

The true gift is not found in packages that are wrapped and topped with a bow—the true gift is our relationship with God in Jesus and our relationship with each other.

So take a moment, this holiday season. Stop and take a deep breath and look around you. Look around the dinner table, around the living room, and around the pews at Christmas Eve service. As you do, not only will you see family, friends, and neighbors, you will see God in Jesus among us.

Council Minutes

November 4, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 10:47 by President Kim Vlcek. When Pastor JonPaul joined us he led us in a devotional prayer.

NON-AGENDA - none REPORTS

The secretary's report was reviewed.

The treasurer's report was reviewed. The September Mission Offering for Mondovi Weekend Backpack Meals was \$247. The October Mission Offering for Shane Giacomino, victim of a swimming accident, was \$279. The profit from the chicken meal at the bazaar sent to Skogden Church to help with flooding concerns was \$774.40. We are a little behind previous year in the positive balance at the end of October.

Pastor report was oral. He performed one wedding during the month of October. There were no baptisms or funerals.

We are now using setting 1 in the hymnal. Pastor is researching the setting to be used during Advent, starting December 2. He will also check to see if we have the candles we need for the Advent season.

Sunday School is going well. Confirmation attendance has been up and down to date.

Pastor would like to have some time off for paternity leave. The Synod allows 6 weeks of paid time off for a full time pastor for maternity/paternity. Pastor will be taking 3 weeks off from Mayo. He has requested the same from us, beginning with the birth of the baby. He will still be available for hospital visits and funerals. If the time off should coincide with Christmas, he will still perform the 5:00 p.m. Christmas Eve service.

Kay made a motion to give the Pastor 3 weeks of paid paternity leave. Ruth seconded it. Motion carried.

We questioned as to a list of substitute pastors for the three Sundays. If we hire a sub we can still have communion.

Pastor JonPaul needs a device (Chrome Book or other computer) to use for church business. He questioned if money set aside for continuing education could be used for such a device, or do we have a line item in the budget that would cover this? We didn't decide at this time if it would belong to the church or to him or who would pay for the maintenance or anti-virus program. Pastor is going to look at some options and get back to us as to what's available and what will do what he needs it to do.

There have been no Ambassador's activities.

A motion was made by Kay to accept all reports. Second by Dale. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Education – Sunday School is running smoothly. We are looking for teachers to sign up for the year. There may be some practice for the program on November 25 and December 2 if the music and scripts have been chosen.

Worship – The Christmas Eve program will be on Christmas Eve at 5:00 p.m. We will have communion.

Property – Dwight has purchased a new TV monitor. It needs to be installed.

We will need someone to plow snow. Dwight will ask Aaron if he is able and interested in doing that. If not, Dale will ask Mark Koser or get a price from Jerry Larson. Dale and Sharon will again handle salting or sanding to keep the ice at bay.

Also, the water system will be looked at to see if we can get some more pressure in the kitchenette. The old part of the church may need to be replumbed, using PEX. We would probably need a fundraiser to cover the cost.

Bazaar – Kay used a Thrivent Community Impact Card for the dinner. She has since found out that we could use another one for other parts of the bazaar. We would need to ask someone else if they would get a card for that. Costs for the bazaar were higher than the last 3 years. Profits were also lower than the last 3 years. We will start a discussion earlier in the year and see if we can come up with

another way to make money for the church; or perhaps have the bazaar at another time of the year.

The letter to the neighbors, the prayer chain, and the congregational study information dissemination are all on hold until the Annual Meeting, January 27, 2019, or later.

We have not yet updated our computer software. Dan Herzberg is still paying \$100 a year for Norton Anti-virus 360. Roxie will call Tri-County and check on our anti-virus to see if that came with the bundling package.

Dave Vlcek is working on forming a Men's group. That, as well as a women's group will be brought up at the Annual Meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Ruthann Kilde Hillesland has requested a transfer to her new church in Sidney, Montana. We will ask Monica to handle that. Ruth made a motion to approve the transfer. Second by Kay. Motion carried.

Pastor JonPaul will connect with some possible new members.

Roxie is working on the 2019 Ministry Plan (budget) and the Opportunities to Serve for 2019.

Sadie is no longer quilting. She has given the leftover yarn to Military Caps ladies group in Durand. They make hats for Operation Shoe Box.

Silent, praying people

Contemplative prayer comes in all sorts of postures, programs and procedures, but the type to which I return time and again I first encountered years ago.

I'll never forget how workshop leaders arranged the chairs in a circular formation; made space available for kneeling, sitting or reclining; dimmed the lights; scattered beautiful icons and fabrics throughout the worship space; and gave each participant a candle.

While I had lit a candle on Christmas Eve, I had never quietly placed my candle together with those of others in a container of sand, reflecting the power of our combined lights, our combined prayers. I learned to focus on the large icons and cross bathed in candlelight. I learned there is nothing like being in a large group of silent, praying people.
