The Bible in 90 Days

Recent surveys show that while 87% of US households own a Bible, most Americans do not engage with the Bible outside of worship more than a few times a year. In fact, 1/3 of Americans never read the Bible! A little more than half of Americans say they have read very little of the Bible. Only 11% report they have actually read the whole Bible.

But, and I think this is good news, nearly 60% of Americans desire to read the Bible more often and consider this an important part of their faith journey.

Engagement and study of God's word is an important part of who we are as Christians. We read, study, teach, preach, pray, and live the scriptures in our daily lives. Scripture plays a central role in the life of followers of Jesus.

I've talked about it on Sunday mornings and online, but this summer I have decided to take a journey. For 90 days, I am working my way through the Bible, from cover to cover. By the time you read this, I will be on week 4 and into the Book of 1 Samuel, having already journeyed through Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, Joshua, and Judges.

Of course, this isn't to brag or show off, but instead to invite you on this same journey. As I have been reading, I have discovered many things that I didn't know before. And, things I thought I knew well, I am discovering again. As I read, the Spirit continually surprises me with these stories.

The Bible is full of love and joy. It's full of fear and hatred. It's full of hardship. It's full of doubt and anger. It's full of family relationships that are both healthy and unhealthy. Basically,

it's full of what it is to be human. And, in the midst of all the messiness that makes up our lives, it shows us how God's love and faithfulness to humans has remained unchanged since "In the beginning."

I love this book. I love these stories. I love this God. And, as I am reading, it has shown me that no matter what happens in this life, God is forever faithful through Jesus and that the Spirit is alive and on the move in our world to usher in God's Kingdom.

So, I invite you to take this journey too. On our website, you will find resources to begin this journey. I invite you to come along and see how God will shape your faith as you go.

Council Minutes,

Sunday, June 10, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 10:29 by President Kim Vlcek. Pastor JonPaul led us in a devotional prayer.

NON-AGENDA REPORTS

The secretary's report was reviewed.

The treasurer's report was reviewed.

The Mission Offering to Peace Church for the sewer clean-up was \$283.00. There is some question as to why there was money returned by Luther Park and why some is still owed. Corissa will follow up on this.

Pastor reviewed his report. Next Sunday we will start using Setting 10 in the ELW Hymnal. Also, a policy has been set for funerals. Monday through Friday Pastor JonPaul can officiate at funerals after 4 p.m. He can also officiate for funerals all day on Saturdays and after noon on Sundays. Corissa will check on the legality of burials after dark, which may impact a 4 p.m. funeral in the winter.

We will have a spaghetti dinner on July 15, after a 10 a.m. service, to help raise money for Mariah's missionary trip to Rwanda. We will see if Dwight can edit his Thrivent Seed Card to be used for Mariah's dinner.

Sunday School and confirmation will begin on September 9, 2018. There will be a parent meeting in August. The learning material will be Here We Stand – online. The cost will be \$14.99 per student and \$69 for the 1 year online subscription. There are 7 students that will be attending confirmation. There will also be a teacher training held.

Pastor is working on getting a worship committee together to help plan services for special seasons of the church. They will start by planning the Advent and Christmas services.

A 10 a.m. outdoor service is being planned for September 16 in Olson Park. The Praise Team will lead the music. There will be a picnic lunch after the service.

Pastor Laurie Skow-Anderson was elected Bishop of the ELCA at the Synod Convention.

The Ambassador's report detailed the camping schedules for the summer, and who will be attending, as well as Annabelle's trip to Texas.

A motion was made by Corissa to accept all reports. Second by Kay. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Education – No further update.

Property – Olson Park has been looked over. There is a lot of underbrush and upkeep that needs to be done. Perhaps the concrete from the old church steps can be left where it is, since it has been overgrown and won't necessarily impact the putting in of stairs.

A building and grounds committee, Dale and Dwight, will work with Julie Schwensen to have a walk-around to get ideas for landscaping, etc. Julie feels it would be possible to put some kind of stairs in the side-hill to get up to the park without driving.

Also, the carpets in the church need to be cleaned. Dale will look into hiring someone that can do that.

Worship – We will have a 10 a.m. service on July 15 followed by a spaghetti dinner to help Mariah raise funds for her year

in Rwanda as a missionary. The outdoor Olson Park service will be on September 16 at 10 a.m.

The membership list is still in progress.

Mission update – Kim would like to start a pen pal project with Maritza. The letters could be written by the confirmation students. They could be scanned and e-mailed to Lauren Vaske, the gal in charge of the program in Guatemala. Also, there are two more trips planned for travel to Guatemala – one in November and one in February.

Praying the plat book - We have a list of "neighbors" of Pleasant Valley. When we have the names grouped into a workable list letters will be sent and we will decide how to effectively pray for them. We may invite a committee be formed to pray for them. We should have that already in the fall, at which point the group of neighbors being prayed for will be added to the prayer concerns, but not individually.

The prayer chain is on hold.

We will look for a youth to sit on council at the next Annual Meeting.

The question was raised; Do we have any line items in the budget where we can take money for Mariah's trip? We have money in the Youth account from soup and sandwich suppers and the Easter breakfast, and we also have money in the Seminary account through Thrivent. Mariah starts training on August 14. Corissa will get the facts on how much Mariah still needs and when it is due. We will discuss this at the July meeting.

The purchase of the new TV monitor is on hold.

NEW BUSINESS

The forming of committees will be put on hold until the end of the summer. We will also discuss having a booth at Cleghorn Fest when we get closer to the date – the second weekend in September. We had talked about changing the format from a ticket-only approach to something to attract kids/adults besides the chance to win something at the bazaar.

Next Sunday Pastor will relate to the congregation what we learned from Pastor Laurie Skow-Anderson from the study she did. He will also do a temple talk on outreach and perhaps the formation of two committees – one

to brainstorm outreach ideas and one perhaps to pray for our neighbors. The reincarnation of our Men's and Women's groups is also something that the council would like to see happen.

In July Kay will get the list of needed school supplies out so we can collect supplies in August – the 5, 12, and 19 – to fill our big backpack. They will be blessed and in the school as the students and their parents come to get ready for the new year.
