

Signed into law in 1914 by President Woodrow Wilson, the second Sunday in May is designated as Mother's Day. This holiday has its early roots in a Church tradition called "Mothering Sunday," which was typically the Fourth Sunday in Lent. On this Sunday, a special service was held for mothers. Over time, the tradition faded and the practice we have today of buying flowers, candy, and cards and calling or seeing our mothers gained prominence.

As this holiday approaches once again, we are reminded of the many mothers in the Bible. In Genesis, we hear of Eve, the first mother, whose children would populate the Earth. Abraham's wife, Sarah, remained patient and faithful to God, becoming a mother later in older age. Rebekah, too, was barren. She trusted in God and gave birth to Esau and Jacob. Jochebed, fearing for the safety of her child, placed the infant Moses into a basket and sent him down the river, hoping and trusting he would find safety. Elizabeth, the mother of John the Baptist, showed great faith and wisdom in bearing the prophet of the Lord. Mary, the mother of Jesus, trusted in God's plan and raised the Son of God into adulthood.

But, like all mothers, these mothers too had their share of heartbreak and disappointment. Eve, for her and her husband's disobedience, would be kicked out of the garden and she would see one of her sons kill the other in jealousy. Sarah, before having children of her own, watched her husband have a child with Hagar. Hagar herself, along with her son, Ishmael, get cast out and discarded once Sarah is pregnant. Elizabeth and Mary both see their sons executed by the religious and political authorities.

Being a mother is, at the same time, an incredibly joyous experience and terrifying one. It is filled with great successes and heartache and disappointment. Motherhood is unlike any

other experience and is a life journey that can be extraordinarily fulfilling.

And yet, Mother's Day can be difficult time for many among us. Some continue to grieve the death of their mother. Some among us grieve the death of their children. Some women had hoped to become mothers, but were unable. Some have experienced the loss of miscarriage. Some have not found a partner to share parenthood with and have not had children. And, there are those among us, who choose not to have children and experience this holiday as a judgment on their choices.

So, we hold all this together; the joys, the sorrows, the loss, the grief, and circumstances of life and offer prayer to God. Whether we are mothers, are estranged from our mothers, have buried our mothers, still hope to one day become mothers, or have entered the years where motherhood is no longer an option for us, it is Christ who holds us. Together, on Mother's Day, we offer prayers of thanksgiving, praise, healing, and comfort to God for all the experiences we share surrounding motherhood. We pray that God will continue to bless our congregation and world with faithful mothers and mother figures who raise up servants of Christ.

We pray that God continues to bless all the women of Pleasant Valley as they lead us in our faithful ministry in the world.

Council Minutes,

Sunday, April 8, 2018

The meeting was called to order at 10:39 by President Kim Vlcek. Pastor JonPaul led us in a devotional prayer.

Pastor Laurie Skow-Anderson revisited us with information about the Congregational Vitality Survey; a summary of the surveys we had turned in, and the Comprehensive Ministry Review; a compilation of the responses she heard as she spoke with us on March 18. We went over both reports. We talked about inactive members – now called Disciples for Jesus – and that we need to check the constitution for the guidelines for membership. She suggested we take a part of the survey and recommendations at each council meeting and decide if we need to act on the survey result/recommendation or not, and what that action might be for each.

REPORTS

The secretary's report was reviewed.

The treasurer's report was reviewed.

The Mission Offering for the Ronald McDonald House was \$214.00. The total monies raised during the Lenten season and Easter follow: \$547 from soup and sandwich suppers, \$256 from the Easter breakfast, \$1,370 from Lenten offerings. The monies have been designated to the Luther Park campers and the Youth Fund budget line item.

Pastor reviewed his report. The end of Sunday School will be celebrated with a Sunday service and BBQ in Olson Park, weather permitting. Otherwise it will be held in the church. It will be on May 13. Corissa and the youth will organize the day and members will be encouraged to invite a friend. Corissa will plan for 75 people and Dwight will get a Thrivent Seed card for the supplies.

Pastor is working on getting a worship committee together to help plan services for special seasons of the church; Lenten and Easter services, Advent and Christmas services. The committee would also take input on the bulletins and how services are constructed.

We will have 7 students in the confirmation class this fall. Confirmation class will begin on September 9, as will Sunday School class.

Pastor also highlighted upcoming events; a baptism this spring and a wedding in the fall. The Council will have a retreat on April 28, from 8 to noon. The Congregational Survey will be discussed during the retreat. We will also revisit reconciliation of the checkbook at that time.

The Ambassador's report highlighted what the Ambassadors did during the Easter season, the upcoming camping season, and the National Youth Gathering in Texas on June 27 to July 1. There is a possibility of having 12 youth attend Luther Park camp this summer. We have one person attending the Youth Gathering. Annabelle will be going to the Gathering with 3 or 4 students from Strum. The Ambassadors had their last meeting on April 23. Corissa also highlighted that there is a Luther Park Spring Work Day on April 21, from 8:30 to 4:30.

A motion was made by Dwight to accept all reports. Second by Kay. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Education – The teachers are set for the rest of the year. The last Sunday School class will be May 13 with the church service and a cook out in the Olson Park.

Property – The ceiling tiles under the balcony need to be replaced. We have a \$201.44 credit from Menard's and will purchase the tiles there. Dwight made a motion to replace the tiles. Second from Roxie. Motion carried.

Worship – Corissa and others will be working on the service in the park for May 13.

Kim has sent the monies collected for Sharing the Dream (in Guatemala).

The process for two people counting the money each week, recording it, and sealing it in a bank envelope was implemented and has been working for the last couple weeks.

The Synod Assembly will be held June 2 and 3 at UWEC. They will be electing a bishop this year. Kim Vlcek and Pastor JonPaul are attending. We would like to have another male volunteer attend. Registration is due by

May 25. Roxie made a motion to cover the cost of 2 members and the Pastor attending. Second by Dale. Motion carried. We will cover the cost of \$250 per voting member and the cost for the Pastor.

Olson Park will need to be cleaned up. We will see if Corissa and the youth members can clean up the twigs, etc. Mark will mow, if necessary. Dave will be asked to handle the sound system on the day of the service.

NEW BUSINESS

We had \$2,000 in our Youth line item fund in the budget. We added \$2,173 to it from the Easter season offerings making a total of \$4,173. This money is earmarked for the Luther Park campers and Annabelle's trip to Texas for the Youth Gathering. There will possibly be 12 campers. Until we have more information as to number of campers and amount still needed by Annabelle, we cannot make any decisions as to how to divide the money. Kay will contact the adults taking the youth to The Gathering to get a firm number as to how much is needed. Camper registration needs to be in on May 1 to get the Early Bird discount. There is also a discount for 1 or more siblings attending. When we have both numbers we can better allocate funds.

Mission Offering: April – 513 Free Pen Project – Kim will describe and highlight the Project during worship on April 15.

May – victims of the water main break in Eau Claire – through Peace Lutheran Church
