

Pastors Corner

July 2019

It's been nearly 4 years since the first time I preached at Pleasant Valley. After that first time, it would only be a few short month and I would be ordained and called to be your pastor.

As I reflect back over these years, I have been thinking a lot about preaching and teaching. Since coming to Pleasant Valley, I have almost exclusively preached from the Revised Common Lectionary; the lectionary that assigns the texts we hear each Sunday and holiday.

Now, the Lectionary runs on a 3-year cycle. There is 1 year each for texts from Matthew, Mark, and Luke; with John's Gospel interspersed throughout the three years. The Lectionary follows a seasonal structure, providing texts that speak to the time of year and the story of Jesus—Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, Pentecost.

We are nearing a point in my tenure here where I will have been with you through a full rotation of the 3-year cycle. What that means is that at some point, the texts that you hear in church will be texts we have heard before during my time as your pastor.

Which leaves us with a few options:

1. The Lectionary provides 4 texts every week: Old Testament, Psalm, New Testament letter, and Gospel reading. I have primarily preached on the Gospel, with some variation. I could, of course, preach on any of the other texts each week.
2. I could preach on the same text as before with a new interpretation in light of our changing culture, where we are as a congregation, and my ongoing learning about these texts.
3. I could just reuse sermons---trust me, we won't be going down this path!

But, I have another idea that I think we will start (in fact, have already started). From time to time now, you will hear me preach on a series surrounding a particular subject, topic,

or book of the Bible. Right now we are working our way through the book of Acts and the story of the early Church.

But, I would like to take this a step further. I would like us to start forming some adult Bible study opportunities around these series as well. I'm thinking about how we can use the sermon as a conversation starter that would continue into some learning time following coffee. This would provide us the opportunity to go more in-depth with certain topics or readings and explore even more how they connect to our lives today.

I'm excited for the possibilities here. But, I need your help! What topics or series would you be interested in? What are some things you've wondered about and would like some in-depth study? Are there things you've always wanted to ask, but have never had the opportunity?

Council Minutes

Sunday, June 9, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 10:35 by Pastor JonPaul. Pastor led us in prayer.

Reports

The secretary's report was reviewed. The treasurer's report was reviewed. Expenses in May exceeded income by \$1,309.73, leaving us \$1,639.68 in the red for the year. The May Mission Offering for Jordan Schadrie was \$289.

The Pastor's gave an oral report. He officiated at Evelyn Mousel's funeral. The Community Praying has only had 2 negative responses. The Prayer Group needs to make sure the praying gets done each month, even when all do not attend.

A motion was made by Roxie to accept all reports. Second by Dale. Motion carried.

Non-Agenda – none

Unfinished Business

Education – It has been suggested that we keep Sunday School going during the summer months for those students that are at church each Sunday. We will try that, since we have the materials, but no video, for the summer.

Worship – During communion, if the parents agree, children of any age may take the sacraments. If Pastor gives the child a wafer, the server should give that child juice. Also, the server should help Pastor serve communion to the Praise Team on Praise Team Sundays, and then the Pastor and the server should serve each other while the Praise Team returns to their places.

Property – A work day to clean up Olson Park took place on June 8. They did not rent a wood chipper. Wood was cut up, brush was stacked, stumps were removed, and the grass was mown. We talked some about getting power up to the park as well.

The gutters on the church have been altered to be able to take the weight of sliding snow. When the gutters are done, we will see

if there is still a water problem in the furnace room and dining room.

There is also a piece of siding on the front of the bell tower that needs to be refastened.

Other – No update on the prayer chain or communication chain.

A date has been set for the outdoor service in Olson Park. We will still try to tie it to the beginning of Sunday School and Confirmation. The service has been tentatively set for September 15, pending agreement of the Praise Team.

The TV is not yet up on the balcony.

Nobody has asked Monica if the computer works better now that we have updated with TCC. Ruth will look into and external hard drive to put on so all our data is backed up, in case of a computer failure.

Outreach – September 7 - Cleghorn Harvest Fest will be handled by the committee.

The kneeling pads at the communion altar need to be replaced or redone. Ruth will be able to work on this, probably in July.

New Business

Planning for retreat for the Council has been put on hold.

We need to secure a group to provide music for the fall bazaar on October 6. Council members, please bring ideas to the July meeting.

We will begin collecting school items for Eleva/Strum schools on the first Sunday in August.


