

Pastors Corner

October 2019

In 1517, when Martin Luther first published the Ninety-Five Theses, he set in motion a series of events that would forever change the face of Christianity. Luther was, by no means, the first reformer of the church, nor was he the last, but the publication of these grievances stands as a pivotal event in Christian history.

But, it was never Luther's intent to break from the Catholic Church. Luther's intent was to work from the inside, to point out what he saw as problems in the Church and work for change. In 1517, Luther would not have imagined a break from the Church that would bear his name; Lutheran.

In truth, Luther was participating in a long tradition in Jewish and Christian faith. Matthew, Chapter 5, starts Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. It is here we read Jesus saying, "You have heard that it was said...but I say to you." Jesus is playing his part as a Rabbi, interpreting and reforming the Jewish faith for his listeners. Much of the New Testament can be read in this light; Jesus engaging in the debates of his time regarding Jewish beliefs and practices and reforming the common understanding of God, God's people, and Law. Certainly, Jesus, Son of God, is more than just a teacher, but he certainly was a teacher and engaged in the debates of his time.

In May of 1882, another reformation was taking place. A group of dedicated and faithful Christians decided to form a congregation, one that would become Pleasant Valley Lutheran Church. Since that time, the congregation has been served by 21 pastors (including 2 interims) and an intern. Pleasant Valley has been a stand-alone congregation, a two-point parish, and even a three-point parish. Throughout its history, the people of Pleasant Valley have continually and carefully discerned who they were in their time and place, as member of the Body of Christ, the whole catholic Church, and the Eleva community. Pleasant Valley has undergone many reformations.

We are to be Ecclesia semper reformanda; a church in continual reformation. On Sunday, October 27th, we will join together to celebrate Reformation Sunday; a Sunday in which we celebrate our heritage in Luther's Reformation and pray for the reconciliation of all our churches. Let our prayer that day also be that we, the people of Pleasant Valley, will dare to dream how once again we are being reformed to be the people of God in this time and place.

Council Minutes, September 8, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 10:28 by President Sands. Pastor led us in prayer.

Non-Agenda

Kim Vlcek was present to ask the council to cover the entrance cost for those women that wish to attend Days of Enrichment, either September 21 or September 28, a Synodical Women's Organization gathering. Steph made a motion to cover the \$20 entry fee for those wishing to go. Second by Dave. Motion carried.

Kim has also been asked to be part of FIN (Faith Innovation Network) – relates to the Synodical Women's Organization and entails talking to others about their faith.

Corissa Sands was present to present a document from Luther Park asking that members sign a Building and Rejoicing Campaign pledge form to help them build the new Ministry Center (chapel). The forms are due by November 4, 2019. Starting in January of 2020 the donations will be matched, up to \$500,000 by the Clevelands.

Corissa also asked about the Christmas program. She is willing to set it up and choose a program. We will possibly have 13 youth to perform in the program. Practice will largely be done during Sunday School times leading up to the program. The program will be during church on December 8, at 9:00 a.m. The Christmas party will be on Saturday, December 7. Ruth will handle the food.

Steve Nelson and Paul Dean, from Thrivent, were present to show us how our investments are doing. As Steve is moving toward retirement Paul, from River Valley Associates, is going to take his place.

Reports

The secretary's report was reviewed. Correction to the August minutes: Income in June exceeded expenses by \$491.79, and exceeded expenses in July by \$219.61, still leaving us \$953.28 in the red for the year. The treasurer's report was reviewed. Income in August exceeded expenses by \$705.81, leaving us \$247.47 in the red for the year. The Mission Offering for Luther Park was \$648.00. We are holding that until January 1, 2020, so it can be a part of the Cleveland matching funds offer. We committed to the fuel pre-buy at \$1.14, but will pay for it as we use it instead of pre-paying.

The Pastor's report was reviewed. There are possibly 5 students for confirmation next year.

Dave made a motion to accept all reports. Second by Dale. Motion carried.

Unfinished Business

Education – Sunday school is set to start on September with the outdoor service and picnic. There will be games in the park for the youth.

Worship – On September 15, 2019, we will have an outdoor service in the park. The service starts at 10 a.m. The Praise Team will handle the music. Dwight will handle the purchase and cooking of hot dogs and brats. Everyone is invited to bring a dish to pass. There will be a campout in the park the night before. Everyone is invited to attend, even if you don't wish to camp. Aaron has volunteered a trailer to put the Praise Team on. Dale will take care of getting stairs for the wagon, and a fire ring.

Property

Kurt Tonn Excavating LLC will be on-site tomorrow or Tuesday to work on the leveling /shaping of the hill to the park. We need to make sure the plan is feasible for the church as far as upkeep.

The TV on the front of the balcony has been installed.

The sand mitigation system for the water and the faucet installation in the kitchenette is completed. Dwight, Dale, and Aaron did the work.

Dwight will see about the drain tile when his backhoe is available.

Power for the park – John Poore spoke to the Eau Claire Electric. They charge a large fee to run the line from the box and to install a meter, plus around \$30 a month for the meter. It was decided that since we wouldn't be using electric in the park for most months of the year, we will hire an electrician to take the power from our existing meter and run it to the park, saving us the cost of installation from the electric company and the monthly cost.

Other –

The USB to keep the computer on-line has been purchased but not installed.

Outreach – September 7 - Cleghorn Harvest Fest was very successful again this year.

The kneeling pads at the communion altar are being reupholstered by Career Development Center. The cost is covered by a memorial to Dick Schuch and his brothers from Sandy Schuch and in honor of Poore's 50th anniversary by Gary and Irene Isaacson.

New Business

The Fall Bazaar will be held on October 6. The service will be at 10 a.m. We have secured the Silver Express, a polka band from Independence, to play during the service and 20 to 30 minutes before the service. Sands Drywall has offered to pay for the group in memory of Joe, Jr. and June Sands. Each member of the group will be offered a free chicken dinner.

The bazaar will again feature cheese and frozen meat drawings with the meat and cheese donated by members. Steph will get coolers to put the meat in and ice packs. We have some quilts to raffle off, and a face cord of firewood. "We have been given a half pig, cut wrapped, and frozen, from Paul Dean, of Thrivent, to raffle off." Roxie is planning a lefse making day on Friday, October 4. Steph will get generic tickets to use for the basket drawings and meat and cheese drawings, and supply us with baggies for the lefse.

Again, this year we are having the baskets for drawings at \$1.00 per ticket. We will also have the meat and cheese drawings for \$2.00 a ticket. We will announce the need for meat and cheese and baskets during church services from now until the bazaar. We will also have games upstairs in the fellowship hall for the youth. Roxie will get the sign-up sheet out for folks to sign.

Randy and Kay Sands have volunteered to handle the dinner. The profits from the dinner will go toward the fuel costs.

We don't have a lift maintenance program. The program should cover the yearly inspection and upkeep. Would it cover State and Federal licenses? Ruth will check on that.
