Council Minutes

Sunday, August 11, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 10:20 by Pastor JonPaul. Pastor led us in prayer.

Non-Agenda

John Poore was present to learn how the park access was coming and offer his help. He asked if the stairs are definite, or will there be a path/road to the far end of the park. The stairs will be put in as a visual. He asked if the cemetery committee still wants a road, which would require a culvert. He expressed the need for power to make the park usable. There was no answer on the road, but Dwight has talked to someone about the power and was told the landscaping needed to be done first, then the power. There was some question as to putting in 100 amps or 200 amps. Dwight will check on difference in price.

Reports

The secretary's report was reviewed. The treasurer's report was reviewed. Income in June exceeded expenses by \$491.79, and exceeded expenses in July by \$219.61, leaving us \$953.28 in the black for the year. The Mission Offering for The Malawi Project was \$321.67. We need to commit to the fuel pre-buy at \$1.14 but will pay for it as we use it.

The Pastor's report was reviewed. There are possibly 5 students for confirmation next year.

A motion was made by Ruth to accept all reports. Second by Dale. Motion carried.

Unfinished Business

Education –nothing to report

Worship – On September 15, 2019, we will have an outdoor service in the park. The Praise Team will handle the music. Pastor JonPaul is handling inviting the neighbors through announcements WEAU, WQOW, WWIB, and WOGO stations. The Synod no longer announces happenings in their churches because of volume. Dwight has gotten a Thrivent Seed Card for the food and other needs for the service.

Property

The trees along the road by the park will be removed, maybe before the September 15 service. If so, the brush will remain in the ditch to be dealt with later.

There is still a piece of siding on the front of the bell tower that needs to be refastened. Dwight will speak to Randy Sands and see if the builders can come back and fix it.

The TV still needs installing.

The sand mitigation system for the water and the faucet installation in the kitchenette will be done after church today.

We need to contact Larry Sands or Dick Bahr to see if the cemetery mower can be used in the park.

Dwight will see about the drain tile when his backhoe is available.

Other –

An external hard drive has been installed on the office computer and will update weekly. Monica has taken the computer in to TCC and had the bugs worked out. There may still be a problem with staying on-line which will require that something be added as a stand-alone to keep us on-line.

Outreach – September 7 - Cleghorn Harvest Fest will be handled by the committee. They are meeting this week.

The kneeling pads at the communion altar need to be replaced or redone. Ruth will be to working on this.

Luther Park student camping is over for the summer. Since one of the students that we had enrolled didn't attend, we have some money that should come back to us. Dwight will check with Corissa on this.

New Business

On July 7 the lift stopped working. The mother board that runs the doors burned out. We have an estimate for replacement of the board, any other parts that are needed, and service calls totaling \$1,456.40. Ruth made a motion to accept the estimate. Dave seconded the motion. Motion carried. The lift has been fixed.

The Fall Bazaar will be held on October 6. The service will be at 10 a.m. We need to secure a group to provide music. A church that features polka music was suggested. It is south of Eleva. Also suggested; Eleva Bell Choir, Joe Roby family (They played last year.) Pastor JonPaul will check on the polka music, possibly the Bell Choir, and also the Joe Roby family to see if any of them are available.

The bazaar will again feature frozen meat and cheese drawings with the meat and cheese donated by members. Steph will get coolers to put the meat in and ice packs. Dwight will check with Steve Nelson, of Thrivent, to ask if he is willing to supply a half hog to raffle off, as he has in the past. We have some quilts to raffle off, and a face cord of firewood. We need to check with Roxie to see if there will be lefse for sale with the baked goods. Steph will also get generic tickets to use for the basket drawings and meat and cheese drawings, and supply us with baggies for the lefse.

Again, this year we will not have thrift sale items. We will also not have the cake walk. We are having the baskets for drawings.

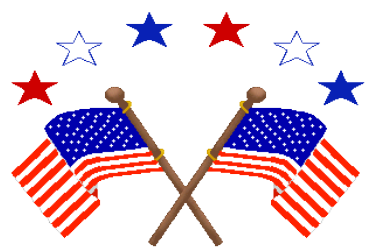

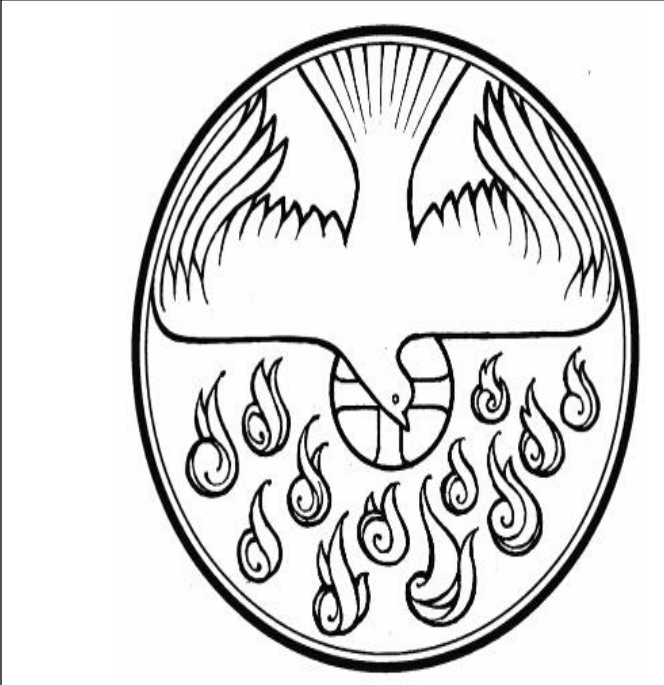
