

On March 17th, people of Irish descent across the world celebrate Saint Patrick's Day. Patrick was born sometime in the late 4th century. At the age of 16, Patrick was kidnapped by Irish raiders and taken to Ireland, where he worked as a slave for 6 years as a shepherd. It was during this time that God spoke to Patrick, telling him to flee to the coast, where a ship would be waiting for him. Patrick followed God's command and returned to his home in Britain, where he would later become a priest. Legend has it that Patrick would later return to Ireland and work tirelessly to convert the Irish to Christianity. An allegory, a moral story with hidden meaning, arose around Patrick's work, claiming he drove snakes out of Ireland. In fact, the "snakes" in the story are the druids of Northern Ireland. Patrick is said to have died on March 17th and this day is a celebration and remembrance of the coming of Christianity to Ireland. Parades, festivals, and parties, including dyeing the river green in Madison, WI, happen across the world.

Patrick isn't the only saint whose commemoration we celebrate in the month of March. Alongside him, we remember hymn writer George Herbert (1st), John and Charles Wesley (2nd), Perpetua and Felicity (7th), Harriet Tubman (10th), Gregory the Great (12th), Joseph, Jesus' father (20th), Thomas Cranmer (21st), Jonathan Edwards (22nd), Oscar Romero (24th), Hans Nielsen Hauge (29th), and John Donne (31st). I invite you to look up each of these saints this month and read their stories. They are sure to inspire faith and give you a laugh or too as well!

On March 1, we begin the season of Lent. Lent is a time for us to reflect on our broken human nature, our sin, and ask for God's forgiveness. It is a penitential time, a reflective time, a prayerful time. And yet, we enter this season with the certain hope that God does indeed forgive our sin and Christ will be lifted up as victorious over sin and death.

These men and women stand as examples of faith. They were human, broken, sinful human beings just like you and me. And, at the same time, they had faith that God, in Jesus Christ, through the Holy Spirit, was doing a new thing in this world. Their faith carried them through times of darkness and tragedy in their lives. They saw their sin, named it, and trusted in forgiveness through Jesus Christ.

Lent is one of my favorite times of the year. Sure, we have confession and forgiveness every Sunday, but Lent is the one season of the year, a 40 day period, in which we intentionally examine our lives. In the season of Lent, we hold up a mirror and take an honest look at our lives; our actions, our beliefs, our attitudes, and the things we have made priorities. As people of faith, we then ask ourselves if those things reflect the priorities and calling of discipleship of Jesus in the world. Where they do not, we ask forgiveness and use this time to re-orient our lives toward Christ.

Lent, then, is not just a season, not just a time of waiting for Easter. Lent is a journey. We travel through Lent as we seek to orient our lives in mission in the world for the sake of the Gospel of Jesus. Through Christ, you and I are transformed, that we might work alongside Jesus for the transformation of the whole world.

That's the heart of Lent. And, it's the reason we still tell the stories of the saints of old.

May the saints of March be an inspiration as we, together start this Lenten journey.

The Pastor's report was reviewed. The worship for Lent will be Holden's Evening Prayer. There was a hospital visit and one pastoral care home visit. We will plan a Council retreat for later in the year. We will work on a mission statement/vision statement then.

Education – Sunday school has been going well. We have teachers signed up for the month of February and all but 1 Sunday in March.

Worship – Ash Wednesday is on February 26. Soup and sandwich suppers will be served at 5:30. Worship will be at 6:30.

Property – Dwight and the Park Committee will work on solidifying a plan for the next step in planning for park access. He has been working with S&K Landscaping, who will be doing the work. The committee members are Nate, Dale, Dave, Dwight, John, Randy, and Greg.

The larger furnace that heats the sanctuary has not been acting up any more. If it does we will call Frank Best, Jr., Heating and Air Conditioning.

The east door was not locking well – or at all. Dave has adjusted it, but it will continue to react to the frost heaves.

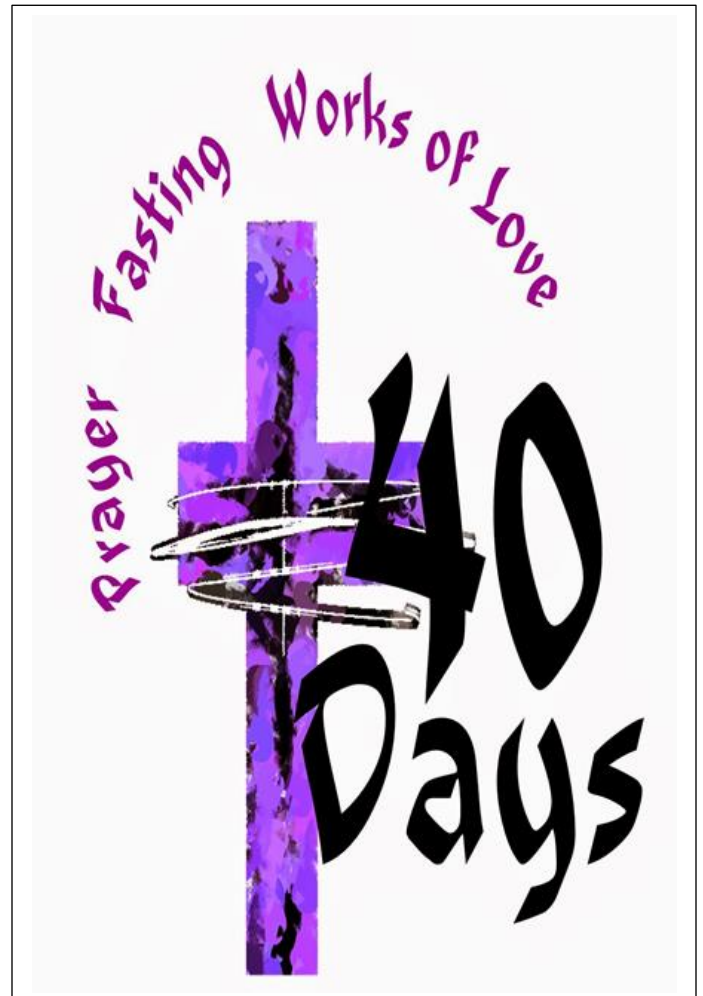

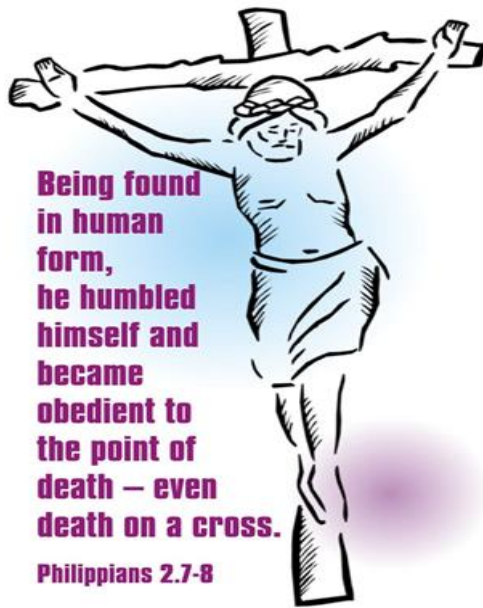
