

In 1517, when Martin Luther first published the Ninety-Five Theses, he set in motion a series of events that would forever change the face of Christianity. Luther was, by no means, the first reformer of the church, nor was he the last, but the publication of these grievances stands as a pivotal event in Christian history.

But, it was never Luther's intent to break from the Catholic Church. Luther's intent was to work from the inside, to point out what he saw as problems in the Church and work for change. In 1517, Luther would not have imagined a break from the Church that would bear his name; Lutheran.

In truth, Luther was participating in a long tradition in Jewish and Christian faith. Matthew, Chapter 5, starts Jesus' Sermon on the Mount. It is here we read Jesus saying, "You have heard that it was said...but I say to you." Jesus is playing his part as a Rabbi, interpreting and reforming the Jewish faith for his listeners. Much of the New Testament can be read in this light; Jesus engaging in the debates of his time regarding Jewish beliefs and practices and reforming the common understanding of God, God's people, and Law. Certainly, Jesus, Son of God, is more than just a teacher, but he certainly was a teacher and engaged in the debates of his time.

In May of 1882, another reformation was taking place. A group of dedicated and faithful Christians decided to form a congregation, one that would become Pleasant Valley Lutheran Church. Since that time, the congregation has been served by 21 pastors (including 2 interims) and an intern. Pleasant Valley has been a stand-alone congregation, a two-point parish, and even a three-point parish. Throughout its history, the people of Pleasant Valley have continually and carefully discerned who they were in their time and place, as member of the Body of Christ, the

whole catholic Church, and the Eleva community. Pleasant Valley has undergone many reformations.

We are to be Ecclesia semper reformanda; a church in continual reformation. On Sunday, October 31st, we will join together to celebrate Reformation Sunday; a Sunday in which we celebrate our heritage in Luther's Reformation and pray for the reconciliation of all our churches. Let our prayer that day also be that we, the people of Pleasant Valley, will dare to dream how once again we are being reformed to be the people of God in this time and place

Minutes

September 1, 2021

The meeting was called to order at 6:05 by
President Stephanie Kuehl. Pastor led us in a
devotional prayer.

The secretary's report was read by members.
The treasurer's report was read by members. For
the month of August, we are in the black by
\$219.45. Year-to-date we are in the red by
\$2,683.09. The Mission Offering for the month of
July, sent to Eleva/Strum backpack lunch program,
was \$251. For the month of August, the Mission
Offering to the Mondovi backpack lunch program
was \$255. The Pastor's report was oral. Pastor
performed a baptism for a baby of non-members.
September 12 will be rally Sunday for Sunday
School. We will continue outdoor services until the
weather no longer allows that.

There was a motion from John to accept the
reports. Second from Courtney. Motion carried.

We will have 2 booths at Cleghorn Fest on
Saturday, September 11. The bazaar raffle tickets
will be made to sell at the Fest. We have a quilt, a
half hog, and a face cord of firewood to put on the
raffle ticket. We have another 2 quilts to sell
outright. We plan on taking the 2 quilts to Cleghorn
to offer for sale at \$200 each. Crystal has also made
an ottoman, called a pouf, to sell, and also to take
orders for. The poufs will be ready for Christmas, if
not before. All proceeds on the ottoman will go to
Pleasant Valley Lutheran Church.

Education – The Sunday school rally day is
going to be on September 12. There will be no
meal. Pastor may use the computer in place of the
TV, or he may not use the televised portion.
Courtney will contact the parents of all children
eligible for Sunday School. Masks will be optional
during the class.

Worship – We will plan the bazaar at the
end of the meeting.

Property – We have no information of the
cost of putting power up to the park by a private
contractor.

Since LED lights have come way down in
price, when they no longer work, all fluorescent
bulbs will be replaced with LED bulbs. We are also
going to find one bulb that will fit in all the globe
lights, and one that will fit in all the exit lights,

making the chore of buying and finding a light bulb much easier. Ruth will check on the cost of recycling the 4' fluorescent bulbs in the basement.

Cortney has brought a water cooler for the basement. We need to find a bottle that fits, so we can refill it as needed. We will also need to find small paper cups to use with the dispenser. We talked about getting a water dispenser for upstairs. That is put on hold until we are back in the church.

Praise Team – The Praise Team will be leading the songs for the service during the bazaar. They will then continue to lead the music on the 4th and 5th Sundays, starting at the end of October, and as weather permits.

BAZAAR
